FARM HOUSE COLLECTIVE Riverside, CA

This project involves the adaptive reuse of the historic Riverside Farm House Motel as a unique indoor/outdoor mixed retail and cultural destination. While protecting the site's historical integrity, Farm House structures will have upgraded state-of-the-art utilities, HVAC, A/V & Furnishings. The lot size is approximately 42,253 sq ft with an estimated 9,649 sq ft of building area and about 26,830 sq ft of outdoor space, which includes decks, recreation area, and interior site path; the remaining square footage accounts for the landscaping and driveway area at the frontage of University Ave.

There are nine locations for food and beverage and six locations for retail vendors. Each food and beverage location will have the infrastructure for providing food and drink within the space. The project will create a comfortable landscaped promenade down the center of the buildings with lounge seating, water features, art installations, and shade structures covering various seating areas. The promenade experience concludes with a turf area at the back of the site with tree groves, a stage, and outdoor recreational elements.

One building serves as a large restaurant, with a bar. Additionally, there will be a mobile beer tap trailer that will service the back garden. A newly constructed building will serve the main restroom facility.

Customers will be encouraged to utilize city bike paths, bus, walking, ride share, Uber/Lyft drop-off, and valet services.

Campus and community leaders gathered at former Parking Lot 8, where the four-story, 63,400-square-foot building is being built. The site is just south of Anderson Hall, where most of the school's program and administration are currently housed.

Beverly and Scott Bailey and family donated \$1 Million to the operations and maintenance of this building after it is built to serve as a catalyst to others to give to the School of Business building for its creation.

Richard Morales and family welcomed son Randall Robert, *right*, who was born April 14, weighing 6lbs 6oz, measuring 19.5 inches long.






GIRL SCOUTS CLASSROOM TO CAREER
